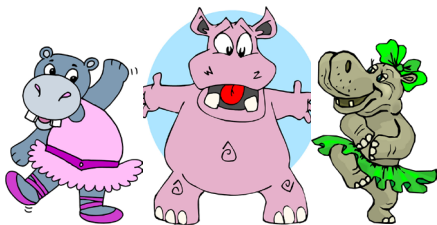


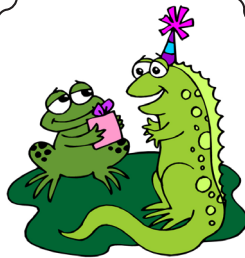
# GENEROSITY

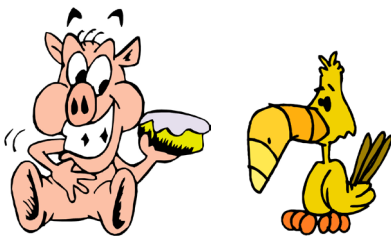
Penelope, Harry, and Tallulah went to the local hospital. They sang and danced for the children who were sick in bed. Were they being generous?
